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NATIONAL CAREER DEVELOPMENT MONTH



HOW TO OBSERVE #CareerDevelopmentMonth

Implement career development programs in your school or business. Invite businesses to join you in developing programs to fill the needs of your community. Try incorporating some of these ideas:

- Host a career fair.
- Assist students and employees of all ages to develop their resumes.
- Offer webinars or online question and answer sessions with business leaders.
- Encourage students to develop a vision board with their goals, people who inspire them, and their skills.
- Match students to job shadow opportunities, internships, and tours
- Employers, set up a mentor program. Encourage employees to both be mentors and get a mentor.

Career CPR (Connect, Prepare, Rise)

The Bay Consortium Workforce Development Board (BCWDB) will be coordinating with the sixteen local Department of Social Services (DSS) in the BCWDB service area to offer Job Readiness Boot Camps to SNAP recipients. BCWDB will contract with Rappahannock Community College (RCC) to facilitate the weeklong Job Readiness Boot Camps. The Job Readiness Boot Camp will be offered virtually with loaner laptop and mobile hot spots available to participants who may need them. It is anticipated that at least five SNAP recipients will be enrolled in each Job Readiness Boot Camp session. Potential participants will be targeted through local DSS referrals, flyers, and mailings.

The Job Readiness Boot Camps will engage participants in critical job readiness skills (soft skills), digital literacy, and nutritional awareness to increase their self-sufficiency, enhance their opportunities in an ever-changing job market, and to lead a healthy life style.
